Snapshot of the World's Water Quality

Media Monitoring Report

Summary

The present report analyzes media coverage of UN Environment's *Snapshot of the World's Water Quality* report launched during the International World Water Week in Stockholm on 30 August 2016.

This report is the result of monitoring of over 250,000 media outlets around the world between 30th August and 2nd September 2016.

Media monitoring was conducted using keywords in six official UN languages and Korean.

The report was launched on 30th August through a <u>global press release</u>, distributed in English, French, Arabic and Spanish, and at a press conference in Stockholm with Hartwig Kremer of UN Environment's Global Environment Monitoring Centre and Dietrich Borchardt of the Helmholtz Centre for Environmental Research.


Top Figures

Overall, at least **456** articles mentioning the report were published globally in **22** languages across **80** countries.

Top coverage included stories by *Reuters, AFP* (French News Agency), *EFE* (Spanish News Agency), *DPA* (German News Agency), *Daily Mail, Fox News, Naver* (Korea), *TV5* (France), *Radio France Internationale, Voice of America, Straits Times, El Tiempo* (Colombia), *El Universal (Mexico), Televisa (Latin America), Standard (Kenya), Gulf News (Bahrain)*. The average potential reach of these articles was nearly **1.8 million readers**.


Coverage Analysis

The report was mentioned in 456 articles globally, most of which were published within the first two days of its launch and enjoyed the greatest potential readership on 30th August.



Number of articles on the water quality report





Coverage by Country

Articles on the report were published in 80 countries around the world – most of them quoting the big news wires (Reuters, AFP, EFE, DPA). Coverage was evenly spread out across the globe, with the largest part of articles published in the US (12 per cent) and South Africa (10 per cent).






Aug 30, 2016 - Sep 2, 2016




Coverage by Language

Articles on the report were published in at least 22 languages. Articles in English accounted for around 40 per cent of all coverage. Around a quarter of all articles was written in Spanish.



Trending Themes

The phrases most commonly used in media articles reflect the main message of the report – the threat posed by pollution of **rivers**, **lakes** and other **waterbodies** to the health of **millions of people** across three **continents**: **Asia**, **Africa and Latin America**.
